

#### 4. GOALS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

A. To increase attendance at the swimming sessions of the Conference. Our attendance was the highest it has been in many years, but it is still not where we want it. Bev Arnold sent emails to all ICGSA swim coach members with a flyer attached about the Conference. Each committee members took copies of the flyer to their respective sectional sites. Flyers were made available at the both the girls and boys State Meets and a verbal plug also was given at the coaches meetings.

- B. *To survey coaches for possible rule changes*. This was done with assistance from the IHSAA. We felt there was not enough support state-wide to take any proposal forward. The one question about coaches being able to talk to their diver during competition, while judging, can be taken care of administratively. - C. *To promote membership in the ICGSA and IHSSCA*. We continue to do this. There was a brief discussion during the Indiana Swimming Fall Retreat last September and another discussion at the Senior State Championships in March, with a follow up meeting to be held in April to try to get the IHSSCA back up and functional again.
- D. To continue using past state champions, mental attitude award winner, and Hall of Fame inductees to lead the state finalist march-in. Each year Linda Horn coordinates this effort. Linda provides a script of trivia for the announcer to read about our celebrity guests. We are indeed grateful to Linda for the many hours she gives to the ICGSA.

#### 5. Other Significant Accomplishments

A. The hospitality room at the IHSAA State Swimming and Diving Finals is coordinated by the efforts of Arlene McDonald. Financial support is given by the ICGSA, IHSAA, and

- Indiana Swimming. Members of the swim committee help prepare food and man the hospitality room. We are indebted to Arlene McDonald, her husband Scott McDonald, Lynn Kinstler of Indiana Swimming, Cindy Britten, Linda Horn, and Bev Arnold for their efforts.
- B. Bev Arnold, Co-Chairperson (District 4), compiled the All State selections. A list of honorees was given to the Awards Chairperson, sent to the wire service, sent to the ICGSA web page, sent to the IHSAA media person, and made available at the swimming sessions of the ICGSA Annual Spring Conference. Award winners were notified and a congratulatory note sent to each coach. A list of honorees is included at the end of this report.
- C. Academic All State selections were compiled by Bev Arnold, Co-Chairperson (District 4). A list of honorees was given to the Awards Chairperson, sent to the wire service, sent to the ICGSA web page, sent to the IHSAA media person, made available at the IHSAA Girls State Finals, and made available at the swimming sessions of the ICGSA Annual Spring Conference. Award winners were notified and a congratulatory note sent to each coach. A list of honorees is included at the end of this report.
- D. The All Time Top Twenty was compiled by Linda Horn and mailed to coaches upon request. Coaches always appreciate the Top 20. Thanks Linda! It is hoped that this list will eventually be permanently on the ICGSA website, too.
- E. Bev Arnold, Co-Chairperson (District 4) and Linda Horn have served the past eight years on the Board of Directors for the Indiana High School Swimming and Diving Hall of Fame. Cindy Britten (District 2) has served on the Board for one year. Bev Arnold and Cindy Britten are the ICGSA representatives to the HOF and Linda Horn is the Top 20 Historian. Also, Bev Arnold is currently the treasurer of the HOF. The HOF sponsored the 7th Annual Hall of Fame Swimming and Diving Classic at Franklin Community High School in December. Additional information about the Hall of Fame and the inductees can be found at the Hall of Fame website.
- F. Scott Kubly, Zionsville High School and Jess Preston, Penn High School were named Coach of the Year by vote of the coaches at the State Finals Meet. ICGSA District Coaches of the Year and State Coach of the Year were selected at the ICGSA Spring Conference. Copies of the ballots are included at the end of this report.

Scott Kubly - Zionsville High School was voted State Coach of the Year.

G. A summary of the IHSAA Girls State Finals as taken from the IHSAA web page follows:

February 9, 2013

Carmel Ties For Nation's Second Longest Streak with 27th Straight Team Title Carmel's girls swimming and diving team won four individual championships, all three relays and set three state records in capturing its 27th consecutive IHSAA team title on Saturday at the Indiana University Natatorium in Indianapolis.

Already the longest streak of state championships in any girls sport in the nation, Carmel tied Pickford (MI) High School's boys track and field team (1952-78) for the second longest string in national high school history. Punahou High School (Honolulu, HI) won 29 straight boys swimming championships from 1958-86 and tops the national high school charts. Carmel's current mark continues to be the longest active streak in the country regardless of sport or gender.

The Greyhounds accumulated 397 points followed by Penn which finished in the runner-up spot for the first time since 1980 with 189 points. Zionsville placed third at 178, followed by Hamilton Southeastern with 127 and Chesterton with 125.

The Greyhounds set the tone right out of the gate with a state record time in the 200 medley relay, winning the event for a fifth straight year and never looked back the rest of the day. Lacey Locke, Alex Clarke, Ariana Bullard and Veronica Burchill teamed to set the new mark in 1:41.17. Locke and Bullard had been part of the Greyhound team that set the previous state best of 1:41.42 two years ago. It was Locke's fourth straight title in the event and Bullard's third.

The Greyhounds 400 freestyle relay completed the day with another record swim. Burchill, Hanna House, Claire Adams and Locke lowered the standard to 3:23.37.

With her two relay crowns today, Locke capped a stellar prep career finishing with 11 state championships overall, tied for second-most in state history with Lindsay Benko of Elkhart Central (1991-94). Carmel's Emily Ayers holds the record with 14 from 1992-95.

Bullard won the 100 butterfly in 53.90 and was a link in the 200 medley relay and 200 free relay teams.

Adams and Burchill, both Carmel freshmen, offered a glimpse of the future winning three individual titles between them and each the maximum four blue ribbon medals.

Adams won the 100 backstroke in a state record time of 53.40 and also edged Western's Summer Brown at the wall by .05-hundredths of a second to win the 200 freestyle (1:49.25). She also was part of the record-setting 400 freestyle relay as well as the 200 free relay.

Burchill won the 100 freestyle in 50.29 and was a member of all three winning relays.

Penn teammates Bethany Galat and Addisynn Bursch finished 1-2 in the 200 individual medley. It was the second consecutive state championship in the event for Galat who finished in 1:59.06 followed by Bursch in

2:00.99. Galat also won the 100 breaststroke in 1:00.29 to help the Kingsmen equal their school's best finish ever.

Northridge's Brittney Walters became the first girls swimming state champion in her school's history when she captured the 500 freestyle in 4:53.49 out of an unlikely lane eight starting position. She had set her own personal best during Friday's prelims with a 4:59.53 and remarkably shaved over six seconds off that time for the championship.

Zionsville's Alex Cleveland took the top spot in the 50 freestyle in 22.99 and Indianapolis Cardinal Ritter's Sarah Bacon carried home honors in the one meter diving competition with 506.95 points.

Lacey Locke Wins Mental Attitude Award

Carmel High School's Lacey Locke was recognized following the state championship meet by the IHSAA Executive Committee as this year's winner of the mental attitude award.

The award is presented annually to a senior, nominated by her principal and coach, who demonstrates excellence in mental attitude, scholarship, leadership and athletic ability.

Locke holds a 3.55 GPA, participated in the American Cancer Society Relay for Life, has been a board member for the CHS Key Club assisting with volunteer efforts both inside and outside of school. Additionally, Locke has participated as a member of the Executive Board with the CHS Dance Marathon for the children at Riley Hospital in Indianapolis resulting in a donation of over \$250,000 to the cause in 2011.

The daughter of Twig and Nancy Locke of Carmel, she will attend Northwestern University next fall where she will swim for the Wildcats.

Indiana Farm Bureau Insurance, IHSAA corporate partner, presented Carmel High School with a \$1,000 scholarship in the name of Lacey Locke.

	In relays, eight individuals may be designated and it shall not count as an entry unless the competitor actually competes in the event. 	197 of the 297 votes received voted yes in favor of this proposal, while 100 voted no. That was approximately 66% yes and 34% no.

	155 of the 297 votes received voted yes in favor of this proposal, while 142 voted no. That was approximately 54% yes and 48% no.
3.	Coaches who serve as diving judges should be allowed to briefly communicate with their divers either verbally or non-verbally during the competition, so long as all forms of coaching cease when the diving referee recognizes the next diver.  Yes No
	221 of the 297 votes received voted yes in favor of this proposal, while 76 voted no. That was approximately 74% yes and 26% no.
4.	Due to the use of electronic diving sheets, should divers be permitted to change their diving order, in addition to being permitted to change up to three dives between levels of competition in the tournament series?  Yes No
	194 of the 297 votes received voted yes in favor of this proposal, while 103 voted no. That was approximately 65% yes and 35% no.
